Looking Ahead to Sunday, August 14

As we look ahead to August 14, Pastor Bob will be preaching from our study of Philippians 1:18-30. This is a bigger section of Scripture than those we've studied thus far, so read ahead and think about the content: Paul is grateful that his imprisonment has unexpectedly freed the Gospel to spread more fully. Then he moves to a section about the value of his life. His life belongs to God in life and in death. As long as the Gospel is preached, then God is glorified. His words make us ponder our own mortality. Then, Paul encourages the congregation to stand strong together in one spirit against anything that would pull them apart. Read through these verses several times and perhaps in several translations.
