



Looking Ahead — Sunday, May 15

We are quickly coming up to Pentecost Sunday on June 5 – the day we remember as the birthday of the church! This was the day God's Spirit fulfilled Jesus' promise to send a comforter and teacher to live with us and do even greater works than they had experienced. Next week we will see the encounter of some disciples as they met the resurrected Lord Jesus who taught them from the Scriptural prophecies about his coming. We will focus on the Word of God next week – read Psalm 19 in preparation. This Psalm teaches us how God loves to reveal himself to those who seek him.
